Parent Academy Information

What do MSIC Parent Academies look like?

MSIC Parent Academies are located in the seven Model school "Clusters", each with a lead school and approximately 22 Cluster schools working together, including middle and secondary schools. **Each Cluster school** will select MSIC Parent Academy representatives to work with parents at their school to decide what programs will be offered within their Cluster. Each MSIC Parent Academy program will have TDSB staff designated to support the Parent Academy, but not run it. A Parent Academy is developed **by parents, for parents**.

Once parents within a Cluster school have decided the programs they want, their parent representatives take this information to a *Cluster Parent Academy Committee*, or "CPAC", where they will work with other parent representatives from schools within the Cluster to collaboratively build their Cluster's unique Parent Academy Program.

Who can volunteer to be on the 'CPAC' Cluster Parent Academy Committee? Any parent can volunteer. Each Cluster school is required to send 1 parent representative and 1 alternative representative. All Cluster schools need CPAC representatives.

Who decides which programs will take place in the MSIC Parent Academies?

Parents in consultation with other parents decide which programs are wanted, the best location for the programs, and the resources needed to support parents taking the program (for example, childcare, transportation, interpretation, food etc.) School and board staff working with the MSIC Parent Academies will help parents locate and manage these services.

How much will these programs cost parents?

By working through community and public partners, post secondary institutions, and TDSB's Continuing Education Department, all programming will be **free** of cost or minimal cost unless otherwise specified. (For example, there might be a minimal cost for materials)
